






According to the University of Cape Town's Children Count statistics in 2022, South Africa has approximately 2.8 million orphans, with over a million being maternal or double orphans. KwaZulu Natal (719,000) and the Eastern Cape province (458,000) have the highest number of orphans.

In response to this crisis, *Duncan*, our OGS Board Chairman, and his wife *Dee* welcomed *Lwellyn* into their home as foster parents after the young boy was left orphaned following his father's death in August 2023. Given that our province has the second-largest number of orphans in the country, OGS embraced *Lwellyn* into the school environment where he is receiving love, education, and mentorship. His integration into the school has been seamless.

In October we were blessed to receive a group of education students from High Point University (HPU) in North Carolina, USA, along with Dr. Tara Shollenberger (Assistant Professor of Leadership Studies) and Dr. Hilary Tank (Assistant Professor). This remarkable initiative showcases the power of education and the profound difference it can make in the lives of those who need it most. Having a younger brother with a 10 year age gap I have been around a lot of children in my personal life outside the schooling and professional aspects and the kids at OGS have some of the kindest and warmest hearts even though many of them who we were blessed to spend more time with after school hours were not from fortunate families in the way on monetary wealth and some not even in the way of familial wealth. I don't think I have ever seen a closer group of children in my entire life. I hope and pray that these students go out and spread what they are learning across the world. I will never feel the same as I did before arriving at OGS and I most definitely will never look at things or think the same and I am beyond thankful for that. This year at Orange Grove School, we commenced the sporting calendar with cricket, athletics, and a few games of tennis. We then progressed to hockey, soccer, cross country, and netball. Our school participated in matches against other schools, including Cradock Pre-Primary, Tarka Primary, Hangklip, Balmoral, Cradock Primary, and Winterberg School Trust. A highlight was when our U10 hockey team won the Best Team of the Day award at the Yellowoods hockey tournament.

The Eastern Province Regional Cross Country event hosted by OGS was also a great success, with approximately 12 of our athletes qualifying for Nationals. We sent six of our athletes, and all performed exceptionally well, with *Amo Smouse* receiving a silver medal and achieving her Nationals colours for two years in a row.

In term four, we focused mainly on athletics, while still playing mini-cricket and hockey. Our team participated in the Regional athletics event in Port Elizabeth, with seven athletes placing in the top ten overall athletes of the day. OGS won the day overall with the most points.

We had many learners qualify for Nationals but decided not to send a team to the National Athletics this year. Our most significant event of the year was the Inter-schools athletics hosted by Orange Grove school, with nine schools and about 300 athletes participating. We had a few challenges during the event, but Hangklip won the day overall.

Our mini-cricketers also played a few matches during the year, with both teams only losing one match in the last tournament. We are proud of all our athletes who demonstrated excellence in batting, bowling, and fielding.

During the 2023 sporting year, we played many inter-house matches, including hockey, soccer, netball, athletics, swimming, and more. Congratulations to Kudu for winning the 2023 sporting year and the House Trophy.

Well done to all our athletes for demonstrating great sportsmanship throughout the year.










# Back 2 Nature...

## ...Back 2 Nature

After taking our older students to Hogsback last term, our younger Back to Nature students got to visit this spectacular part of our country for themselves this term. We had a lot of fun exploring waterfalls, identifying trees and birds that don't occur in our area and enjoying the very different scenery. The grade 1's and R's had a day excursion to a nearby farm where we went fossil hunting. Although we didn't find any spectacular skulls, we did find a few little bones and learned about where to look for fossils. Between our field trips, we learned about photosynthesis and the solar system and finally wrote a test on what we'd learned this year.

## Archery

We started off the term with two of our archers attending the National Indoor competition in Port Elizabeth. The competition is shot at various venues across South Africa and the scores collected and collated. ## Alumni news


