Congratulations to all the graduating Grade R students as they transition to Grade 1 next year!
















Classroom news

Back 2 Nature

Last term it was elephants, this term it was zebras. We took two groups on a day trip the Mountain Zebra National Park, where we not only saw the endemic Mountain Zebra but also a host of other antelope and birds. Our oldest students did a day trip to the nearby Tsolwana Game Reserve where they also got to see zebras and various antelope species as well as take a short walk to some San rock art. The grade R's and 1's didn't venture as far from home but did a drive on our very own Orange Grove Farm where they ALSO saw zebras as well as some magnificent views of their house animals - gemsbok and kudu. Between the field trips, we squeezed in a spot of springtime birding and everyone from grade 4 and up wrote a test on what they had learned this year.

Archery

We started off the fourth term with a trip down to Grahamstown with five of our archers, where we participated in the indoor archery nationals. Since Covid, this event has been shot at numerous different locations around the country, making it much more accessible to us. All the scores from across the country are compared for the final result. Our five archers brought home two silver and one bronze medal in their respective categories and we are exceedingly proud of their achievement.
